# Chambers Health to open new Dayton medical facility in Sept.

Chambers Health has announced that it will open a new primary care medical facility in Dayton on Sept. 1. The location will be the first to utilize the company's new OmniPoint Health name and brand.

The new facility will be a first of its kind for the Dayton area, offering more than 4,000 square feet of space. With 10 examination rooms, one procedure room and board-certified primary care providers.

"We recognize the importance of high-quality healthcare close to home," said William Kiefer, Chambers Health Chief Executive Officer. "By offering a variety of services and same-day appointments, we are here to eliminate the days of waiting or traveling to get the care you need."

In addition to primary care providers, OmniPoint Health will offer onsite labs, radiology, immunizations, wellness programs and more. The new facility will be located in the Prairie Center off Highway 90, east of North Winfree Street.

"Every person in our area deserves to live active, happy and productive lives," Kiefer said. "We believe our company is a catalyst to helping achieve that goal in every community we join."

On Aug. 2, new patients can begin scheduling appointments for its opening in September. Hours of operation will be Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with plans to offer services after hours and on weekends.

"We are dedicated to serving the needs of this community," Kiefer said. "This facility is just the beginning of the extended services we are planning for residents, giving them world-class healthcare with the hometown, personalized care they deserve."

Chambers Health unveiled its intention to change its name to OmniPoint Health in a move that represents the transformation happening at the health system, which includes expanding locations to provide care to residents in rural areas. The name change for the entire health system and its existing facilities will occur January.

between Galveston and Indianola as the chief port of Texas.

Meanwhile in Galveston, yet another plan for constructing a seawall was being considered. A proposal to create a continuous seawall ten feet above mean low tide was made by civil engineer Henry A. Peeler, who had done some of the first work on the intracoastal canal, and seconded by Galveston city engineer H.T. Wilson. It would be made of concrete

blocks five feet square by fifteen feet long and backfilled with sand. A group of businessmen, members of the seawall protection committee, had developed a workable plan to pay for it, including a bond election for condemnation and purchase of property along the beachfront. But just like previous attempts, this one got mired down in politics, money, and delays and by November 1887 was dropped from the agenda completely. One reason given against the seawall by a well-known Galveston figure was that "it would be an undoubted method of publishing to the

world that we consider the situation unsafe." Go figure.

(\*Note: the Saffir/Simpson scale of hurricane intensity was implemented in the 1970s. Hurricane categories prior to that were determined from newspaper reports and other meteorological data.)

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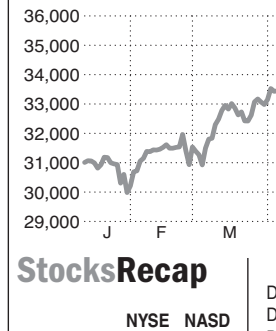
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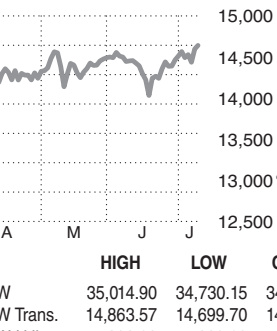

## Services firms enjoy revival

now hiring

When COVID-19 slammed into the U.S. economy in March 2020, services businesses suffered the biggest hit. Restaurants, shops and theaters shut down. And consumers took refuge at home to wait out the crisis. The impact rocked the Institute for Supply Management's services index. From March to April, the index plunged from 53.6 to 41.6. (Any reading below 50 signals a contraction, any figure above 50 reflects growth.) The comeback since then has proved as dramatic as the collapse that preceded it. By June 2020, services firms were expanding again. And

eager to spend. The revival is good for the overall economy: Services account for 84% of private-sector jobs. Businesses can't even keep up. They are posting job openings faster than they can fill them, which is why the ISM's hiring index for services actually turned negative in June.

the ISM index, on a 13-month winning streak, has registered a sizzling 60 or more for the past four months, including a record 64 in May. As more Americans are vaccinated and viral cases fall, consumers are heading back out, and businesses are
